- Sustainable Development Goals

The new 2030 Sustainable Development Agenda recognises that gender equality, the empowerment of women, and the elimination of violence against women and girls are central to sustainable development for all.

Now governments must match the ambitious agenda with decisive action and adequate resources.



Zonta International's focus is on Goal 5: Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls. #Goal5 calls for the elimination of all forms of violence against women & girls, the end of all forms of gender-based discrimination, and the elimination of harmful practices such as child marriage and female genital mutilation (FGM). It

also calls for ensuring universal access to sexual and reproductive health and reproductive rights.


