Dinner Meeting: 18th February

Our Guest Speaker at the February meeting was Cheryl Bullion, Warwick State High School Principal. Cheryl was accompanied by Michelle Ferndinad, who is Head of Department of the Student Well Being Team. Cheryl provided an overview of her career spanning over 40 years, with her first teaching position at Stanthorpe and returning to the area as Principle of WSHS 3 years ago. Cheryl and Michelle are keen to build stronger association with Zonta Club of Warwick, and there was discussion about how to forge this relationship:

- Each year, WSHS distributes information about the Zonta Bursary to Grade 10 students. Michelle has indicated that for 2014, students will be assisted with the application process.
- Girls at WSHS will be invited to participate in the assembly of Birthing Kits; Zonta committed to providing Certificate of Participation for each student (which could then be integrated into their CVs)
- Zonta will forward information on the Young Woman in Public Affairs award, and WSHS teachers to promote / encourage applications.
- WSHS suggested potential project for Zonta Club of Warwick Inc, namely donations of formal uniform/s to be loaned to students (eg for award ceremonies). Members are keen to pursue this option.

Nomination Committee:

Service Committee:

Jen-Rose received a request via Frontier Services (formally Flynn of the Inland Service which is administered by the Uniting Church) for personal items to go to the families suffering in the present drought as a reminder we are thinking of them plus a 'treat' for the women and children. Jen-Rose instigated compiling 30 adult and 20 children's pamper packs, and these were forwarded to Frontier Services in Charleville for distribution.

Advocacy:

Karen had written to Southern Downs Regional Council Media Advisor Sonia Wood requesting information about council initiatives to improve women's safety within our community. Zonta received a response (dated 10 February) advising that the SDRC Community Plan 2030 has a number of goals and directions related to women's safety. SDRC highlighted these initiatives:

- 1. Increased CCTV network in Warwick and Stanthorpe
- 2. Increased lighting along Quart Pot Creek (Stanthorpe) in response to request from young women who use this area for recreation / exercise
- 3. Partnering with Qld Police Service to stage several Crime Forums, which include information on women's personal safety
- 4. Partnering with Qld Police Service to present self defence sessions for women
- 5. Councillor Denise Ingram is on Domestic Violence Committee
- 6. White Ribbon (Not Violent Not Silent campaign) stickers are placed on SDRC vehicles
- 7. Councillor Neil Meiklejohn is White Ribbon ambassador
- 8. Domestic Violence helpline contact details are placed at public toilets and council facilities
- 9. Mayor Peter Blundell participated in the 2013 CEO Challenge this is an Australian wide campaign to help reduce domestic violence in workplaces, communities and homes. Cr Blundell raised \$8,800 in

fundraising as well as raising awareness of domestic violence. As part of the Mayor's campaign, SDRC purchased a training package that helps organisations to identify and support staff members who may be dealing with domestic violence issues.
